Purpose of the role:

To promote and encourage the use of ICT amongst older people by:

1. Supporting members and users to learn the basics of computers and the internet in a relaxed, informal environment.



Mission

We support older people to lead fulfilling lives improving their health, well being and quality of life. We promote the development of an inclusive community in Southwark in which older people support each other, are independent, active and in touch.

What will I do?	 You'll offer advice, information and support to members and users who want to get online and learn how to use a computer for the first time, or improve their confidence with the basics. Tasks could include some or all of the below: Help service users learn the basics e.g. teaching someone how to use Google, use the mouse and keyboard or set up an email account. Help service users understand the benefits of getting online e.g. showing them how to search or apply for a job online, shop and bank online or use Skype to connect with family and friends. Assist training providers during sessions by giving extra support to learners, and supporting service users during IT open-access drop-ins. Act as an advocate of the benefits of being online. Offer informal advice on keeping safe online e.g. guarding against identity theft, phishing and scamming
